Background:

As part of a dialogue series that began with the "Age of Connectivity: Cities, Magnets of Hope", this High-level Working Session will address opportunities and challenges facing a rapidly urbanizing world, ending with a Clarion Call for Action!

The insights and expertise of a selected international group of non-traditional government executives, global business and financial CEOs, entrepreneurs, technology innovators, educators, cultural experts, artists and thought-leaders will address and leverage their knowledge and skills by addressing this year's theme: "Urban Futures...South Meets North"Connecting the Dots for Sustainable Development." This session will feature the unique innovating winning projects from eight countries: China, Guatemala, Ireland, Sudan, South Korea, United Kingdom, United Arab Emirates, and the United States which address the "Agequake" facing the world today.

This High-level Working Session is co-organized by the UN Human Settlements Programme (UN-HABITAT) and the International Council for Caring Communities(ICCC), and in collaboration with the World Health Organization, Governments, and other UN and UN-Habitat agenda partners, including the private sector, academia, civil society and Asia Pacific Exchange and Cooperation Foundation.

Participants will engage in discussions on creating a platform for policy dialogue to effectively address challenges resulting in quality of life improvements for all generations, achievement of the implementation of MDGs, support of the UN Habitat Agenda and and in support of the HABITAT III preparatory process.

This Session will celebrate World Habitat Day, "Changing Cities: Building Opportunities," and the International Day of Older Persons, "Longevity: Shaping the Future" and reexamine, rethink and redefine current practices and identify viable recommendations for scaling-up successful projects and stimulating new concepts.
