1 March 2016 competition winners presented their winning projects from schools of architecture in 6 countries: China, Portugal, Russia, Spain, Tanzania and the United Kingdom

The Competition established in 1994 has been organized by the International Council for Caring Communities in support of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Organized in support of Habitat II as a bridge between research and practice endeavoring to prepare the next generation with the tools essential to enhance the quality of life for the fast growing “graying society.” Since its launch, over 9,000 students from more than 60 countries have participated in the competitions.
